


Setting the link resolver Find it @ H/Library in Google Scholar

Google Scholar is a very useful tool for finding scientific and scholarly articles. The digital collection of the THUAS-library can be connected to Google Scholar so that you immediately can see if you have access to an article, via our link resolver **Find it @ H/Library**

When you're on campus, Google Scholar is already set up properly. And the [browser tools Lean Library](#) and [LibKey Nomad](#) do this automatically; on THUAS computers they are included in Microsoft Edge by default. We recommend that you install these tools on your personal computer as well.

If **Find it @ H/ Library** is still not visible, you can also adjust Google Scholar manually:

1. Go to Settings (you will find it under the 'hamburger menu' in the upper left corner)
2. Click on Library links
3. Search for *haagse* or *hague* in the search bar
4. Set a mark by *haagse hogeschool*
5. Save your settings
